

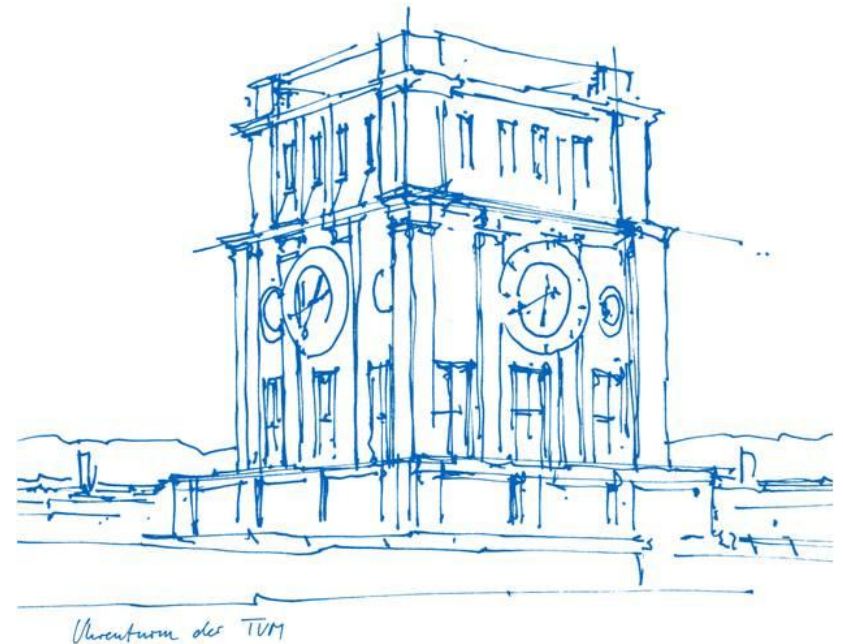

The rules

- (1) The use of inadmissible auxiliary means and materials is not permitted. Keeping inadmissible auxiliary means available (for examples notes or turned-on mobile phones) is not permitted.
- (2) **Auxiliary materials must not contain any comments (in particular no words, numbers, figures and symbols)**. However, occasional underlining is permitted, so are color mark-ups in horizontal direction. The use of post-its as registers is permitted as long as those **only contain the §/Art. and the numbers** and do not circumvent the prohibition of comments.

→ **The official name/heading of the section is NOT allowed on the post-it!!!**

In particular, the following applies:

- Post-its may only contain **one paragraph each**. The **paragraph** noted on a post-it **must be found on the double page** to which the post-it is attached.
 - Post-its may be used in different colors and can be used for systematics.
- (3) Any attempt to influence the result of an examination by using inadmissible auxiliary materials to one's own or the advantage of others will result in the concerned exam being marked as „**5,0 (insufficient)**“.

NOT allowed

- No words, numbers, figures, symbols, etc., in the statutes!
- No paragraph references in the statutes!


